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Preservation Long Island to Publish Historic Decorative Arts Book Elias Pelletreau: Long Island Silversmith and Entrepreneur, 1726–1810

Cold Spring Harbor, NY— Preservation Long Island is pleased to announce the forthcoming publication of its latest book, *Elias Pelletreau: Long Island Silversmith and Entrepreneur*, 1726–1810

Targeted for release in early December 2018, this work represents a return to Preservation Long Island's roots in the study of historic decorative arts which began in earnest with the 1976 publication of *Long Island is My Nation: The Decorative Arts and Craftsman, 1640-1830* by the Long Island decorative arts specialist, Dean Failey. Pelletreau was Failey's first and last subject of intensive study before his death in 2015. In completing Failey's last project, this book honors his contribution to field.

Elias Pelletreau (1726-1810) lived and worked in his hometown of Southampton. A Long Island contemporary of Paul Revere, he was one of very few early American rural silversmiths to run a successful business that produced complex silver forms. His clientele came from among the most influential Long Island families of the time and included the Tallmadges, the Gardiners, the Floyds, and the Jones and many others.

In addition to featuring over fifty works by Pelletreau and his contemporaries, the lavishly illustrated new book catalogues the nearly 170 artifacts; silver, paintings, and furniture from the Long Island Museum's *Elias Pelletreau* Exhibition that will illuminate the life and times of one of this region's most significant early American artisans. The book will serve as the printed companion to the exhibition and symposium.

The Elias Pelletreau Symposium will take place at the Long Island Museum on October 27, 2018 from 9am-4pm. The symposium will feature scholars who will examine Pelletreau's fine craftsmanship and his role in the complex trade and social issues of the time.
